Purpose Statement

Simple Teaching Paragraphs

- It is not for showing off knowledge.
- It is for **knowing Jesus Christ** and obeying His Word.

A **disciple** is a **learner**.

- That means you keep learning for your whole life.
- You learn so you can live what the Bible says.

You must do **your work yourself**.

- **Do not** copy answers or let others coach you.
- God wants **truth** in your heart and in your work.

Try to **learn the lesson** well before you move on.

- Correct mistakes and learn why they were wrong.
 - Mastery helps you grow strong in understanding.
